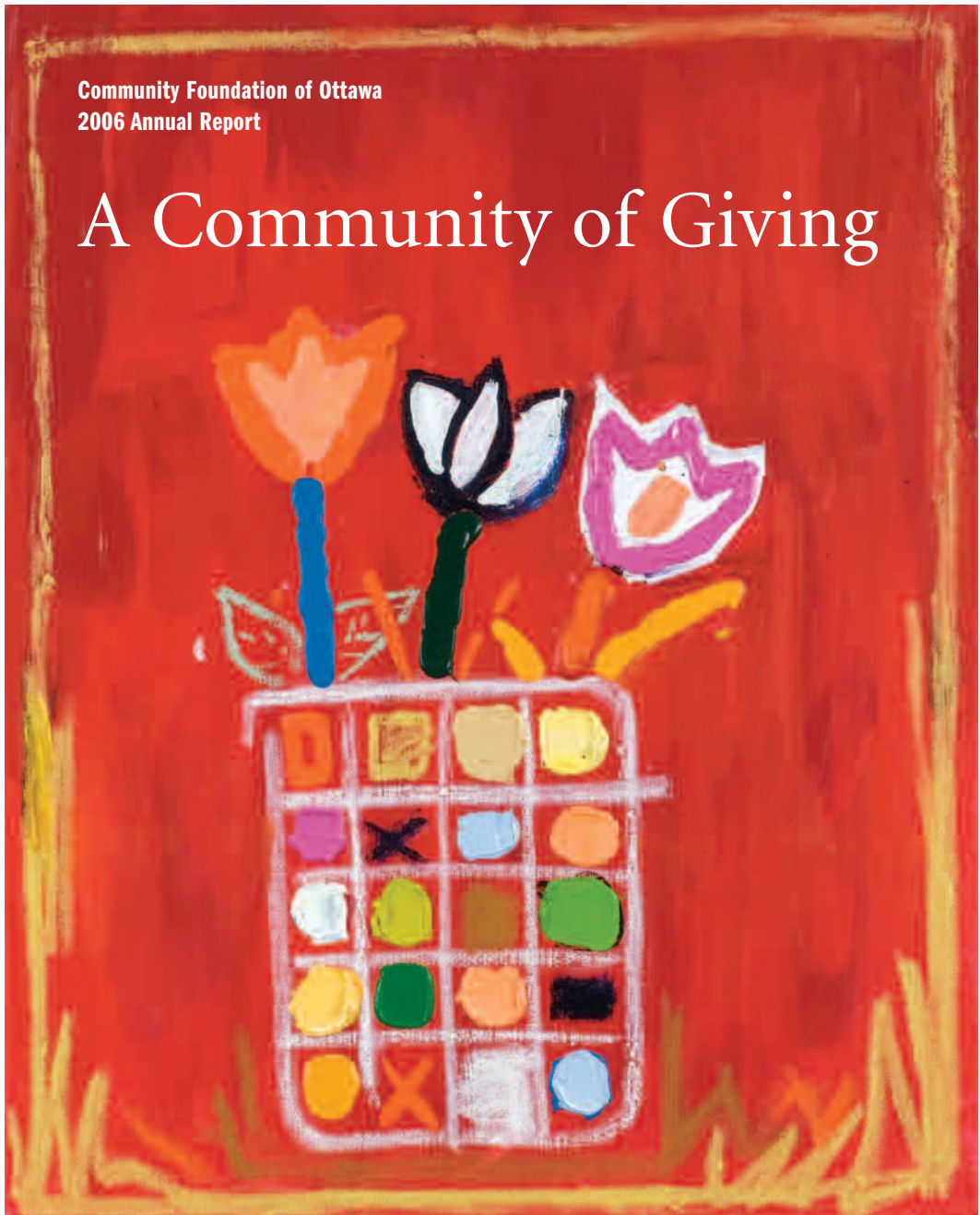

The Community Foundation of Ottawa manages a large variety of funds on behalf of an ever-growing number of donors.

Community Funds constitute the core of the Community Foundation's ability to strengthen our community by meeting emerging opportunities and addressing issues of importance as they change over time.

Field-of-Interest Funds allow donors to direct grants to a particular area of interest, such as social services, the arts or the environment.

Donor-Advised Funds allow donors to be actively involved in selecting recipient charitable organizations. This type of fund is considered the most effective alternative to the creation of a private foundation.

Designated Funds allow donors to choose specific charitable organizations that will be perpetual beneficiaries of the annual income generated by their gifts. If the charity unexpectedly ceases operations or significantly changes its focus, the Foundation will redirect the fund to a similar charity.

Educational Award Funds are used to provide educational awards, scholarships and bursaries to help students pursue academic goals.

Memorial Funds can be established through the Community Foundation in order to create a lasting tribute to a special member of the community or loved one.

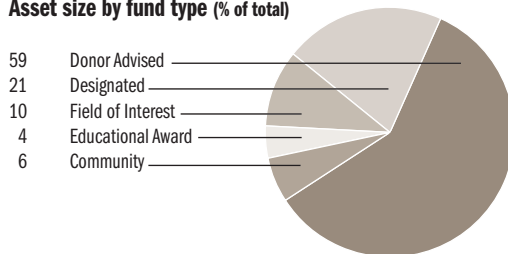
Organizational Endowments can be established by organizations with registered charitable status in order to benefit from the Community Foundation's professional investment management and endowment administration expertise.

Flow-Through Funds allow donors to give advice on disbursements to charitable organizations or causes within a given year.

Thanks to the generosity of all of our donors, along with sound financial management, the total value of the 551 funds held at the Community Foundation of Ottawa reached \$96 million in 2006.

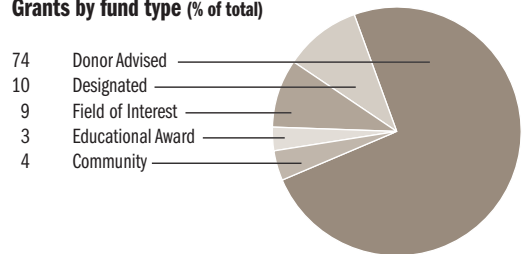
Asset size by fund type (% of total)

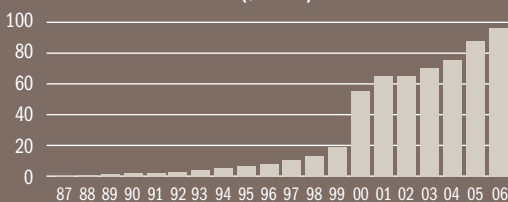

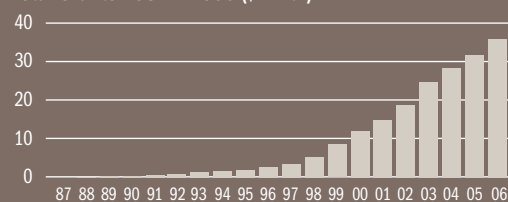

I'm fighting Dystonia



My name is Kelda.

I have Dystonia, a neurological disorder that causes my body to twist and distort itself into abnormal positions. Since 1996, I've had twelve neurosurgeries to try to defeat this affliction. It has yet to be overcome.

But I am not a quitter.

For over ten years, I've participated in every local fundraiser I can find to combat Dystonia.

One day my banker suggested there might be a way I could do more. He recommended endowing a fund at the Community Foundation of Ottawa, which will provide funding for as long as it takes to fight the condition.

Now my fund will be working as hard as I am to battle the debilitating effects of Dystonia.

The K.C. Whalen Fund

A Donor-Advised Fund established with the Community Foundation of Ottawa in 2006 through the BMO Financial Group's Supporting Your Community program. This alliance has been connecting BMO clients with community foundations across the country since 2003, and has resulted in nine funds with the Community Foundation of Ottawa, creating a great many opportunities for donors like Kelda to make a lasting impact on the causes they care about in the community.



I'm fulfilling my
grandmother's dream

My name is Mary.

When I was growing up in Sri Lanka, my grandmother made me promise that I would become a nurse and look after others. It was a promise I was destined to keep. I worked as a registered nurse for 15 years.

Then we moved to Canada. For four years, no one could hire me without my Canadian license, and gaining my accreditation would cost more than five thousand dollars.

Then, I heard about the Ottawa Community Loan Fund's program for foreign-trained nurses. They loaned me enough money to go to school and earn my license.

My husband and I are now the proud and busy owners of a group home for former psychiatric patients in Brockville. It makes us happy to share our home and family with them. I'm so thankful to be recognized as the nurse I was destined to be here in Canada.

Ottawa Community Loan Fund (OCLF)

A Community Foundation grant supported an OCLF program to provide micro loans to foreign-trained nurses, doctors and technical professionals to allow them to study and gain their Canadian accreditation.

I'm going to succeed



My name is Lyna.

I quit school when I was 15. Things had just been too rough in my first year of high school, and they obviously weren't going to get better.

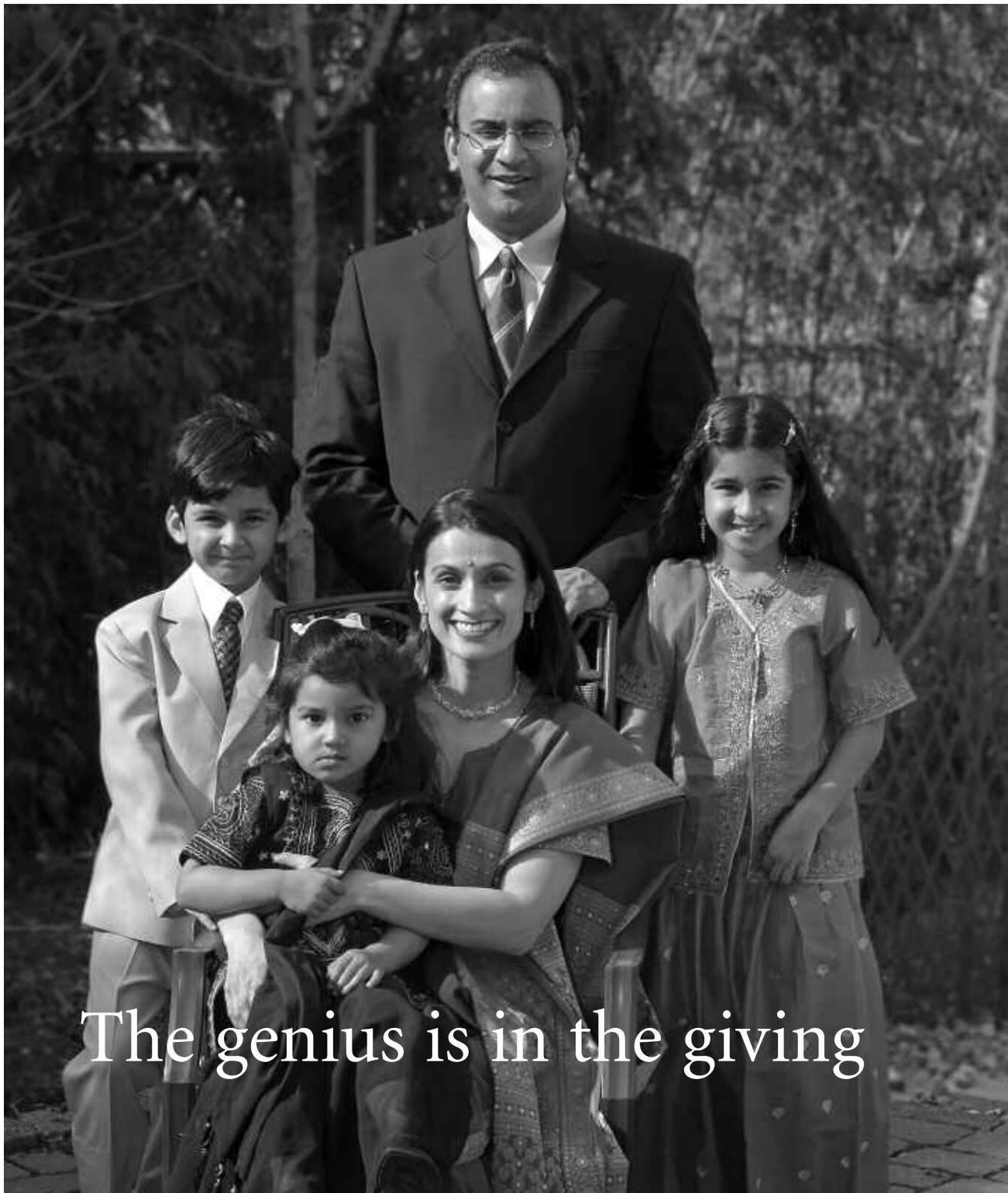
Then I left home. 'Cause nothing was getting better there either. But after working at a dollar store for a while, I realized I wanted something more for myself.

That's when I heard about Operation Go Home's high-school credit program.

I started studying grade ten Math and English at the centre, and I actually started to like it. For the first time, I was getting 85's and 90's on my tests. Now I'm back at a high school, working towards getting my diploma.

I just can't decide whether to become a pastry chef or an accountant when I grow up.

I guess I could always be both.



The genius is in the giving

My name is Nalin. This is my family.

Like many immigrant families, we share the same story. Many people come here with nothing, working to stake out a better life.

After some generations, appreciation for what we've achieved turns into a deep desire to give back to the community and be counted as a contributor. That's what my father taught us.

He said: "Anybody can become an expert at looking after themselves, their own needs, their own wants; the real genius lies in looking after others".

Our fund at the Community Foundation, and our work on the Maharaja's Ball, are allowing us to fulfill that dream. Through it, we are staking out a better life for everyone around us.

Funds

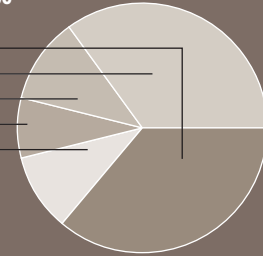

Investing in People Award: Festival Champion

Catherine O'Grady has been a dynamic member and advocate of Ottawa's arts community for many years. As Executive Producer of the Ottawa Jazz Festival and Artistic Producer of the Ottawa International Children's Festival, Catherine's unwavering dedication to making Ottawa a vibrant, creative city for residents and visitors alike deserves recognition.

Catherine's commitment to quality programming of both music and children's theatre has contributed significantly to the Ottawa arts scene and the development of a more knowledgeable audience base in the region. The jazz festival also provides an internationally-respected venue for the promotion and support of local musicians, creating opportunities that reach far beyond the festival gates. As a steering committee member of Ottawa's Arts Investment Strategy, Catherine has also been instrumental in making arts issues a priority in municipal planning for the future.

The Community Foundation of Ottawa's Investing in People Award is presented each year to support those who have shown imagination and leadership in addressing issues and opportunities in our community. The recipients, having been identified by the Board of Governors, are invited to accept a \$5,000 grant from the Foundation, for which they design the purposes. Catherine will use the grant for the Children's Festival's outreach activities, which will enable hundreds of children to attend the festival at no cost.

Lee Matasi Memorial Fund: Artist Interrupted

A budding artist and avid skateboarder, Lee Matasi was gunned down in 2005 a few weeks before his 25th birthday in his hometown of Vancouver. Lee had just graduated that spring from the Ottawa School of Art, where he had shown great promise as one of Canada's up-and-coming artists, winning a scholarship and the Royal Canadian Academy of the Arts award.

Lee's death has sparked numerous crusades around the world, including the Canadian Artists against Violence campaign. Other tributes have come in the form of fundraisers, numerous songs and graffiti tributes, and the christening of the Lee Matasi Gallery at the Ottawa School of Art. The Lee Matasi Memorial Fund was created to support gifted third-year diploma students in financial need at the Ottawa School of Art. This way, Lee's legacy will always endure while the fund cultivates new artists of promise each year.

Ottawa Sustainability Fund

Ottawa prides itself on being an exceptionally livable city. However, environmental studies show that Ottawa is not a sustainable city. Like all medium to large-sized cities, Ottawa is at significant risk of undergoing a decline in its overall quality of life due to human impact on the environment. Thanks to the City of Ottawa's Environmental Advisory Committee, the Ottawa Sustainability Fund (OSF) was established in 2006 to respond to this challenge.

The purpose of this fund is to support community-based programs and initiatives that will further Ottawa's sustainability in the broadest sense. As the fund grows, it will provide funding to help our community respond to climate change; improve air quality; address urban and rural water issues; promote waste reduction and sustainable waste management; and promote sustainable land use. Heightened awareness of sustainability and environmental issues make the OSF an ideal vehicle through which all citizens will be able to contribute to maintaining our community's quality of life in perpetuity.

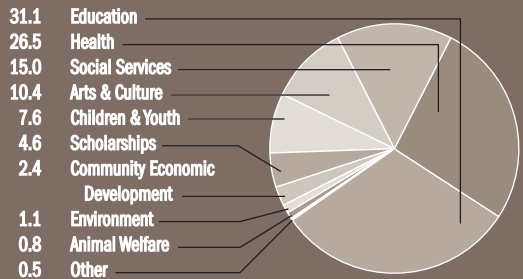

Ottawa Chinese Community Service Centre: In pursuit of happiness

The “Happy Settlement, Better Community” program is giving Ottawa’s new Chinese community members a chance to get to know the city’s wider community and what it has to offer. In the first year, participants went on a wide array of scenic and cultural tours of such attractions as Gatineau Park, the Parliament Buildings, and local museums and libraries; and informational tours of community health and resource centres.

One of the program’s main objectives is to reduce the isolation and anxiety felt by the older generation of new Chinese immigrants, introducing them to key services they might not otherwise access. The program also gives the rest of the community an opportunity to learn more about their new neighbours. One of the program’s most successful initiatives was an outdoor Tai Chi training class, which gave new immigrants a chance to practice this traditional form of yoga and meditation, and share it with the wider community.

Applying for a Grant

The Foundation's grant programs benefit us all.

Through its grantmaking programs, the Community Foundation of Ottawa is committed to seeding, nurturing, supporting and strengthening our community. Grants are made to not-for-profit organizations in all sectors that are recognized by the Canada Revenue Agency as registered charities.

The Community Foundation of Ottawa provides funding through two different grant programs: the Community Grants Program and the Strategic Impact Grants Program. The Community Foundation also administers a grant program for The Ottawa Citizen Literacy Foundation.

Application Deadlines:

Community Grants Program: February 1 and September 15

Strategic Impact Grants: February 1

The Ottawa Citizen Literacy Foundation: October 1

Community Grants are made for projects in support of social services (including projects for the visually impaired, children, youth, seniors), animal welfare, arts and culture, community economic development, education, environment and health, primarily within the Ottawa region. The average grant is approximately \$7,000, with the largest grant of up to \$10,000 being provided for projects which are particularly innovative and compelling.

Strategic Impact Grants are broader than Community Grants and may include multi-year funding, larger amounts (over \$10,000), project funding, as well as grants which focus on building organizational capacity or seeding new programs.

Grantmaking Process

The Community Foundation solicits and accepts grant applications from organizations that meet our funding guidelines. These grants are supported by the generosity of donors who have directed their funds to unrestricted purposes or to a broad field of interest. Grants may also be selected for funding by one or more donors.

In making its grantmaking decisions, the Community Foundation's Board of Governors relies on the expert advice of a Grants Committee, which is made up of volunteers who are knowledgeable about local issues, as well as representatives from Ottawa's other major grantmaking organizations. Guided by the Foundation's funding priorities and other criteria, the Committee evaluates grant applications and makes funding recommendations to the Board.





Note to the Summarized Financial Statements

Distribution and Reinvestment of Annual Investment Earnings

The Foundation's Distribution and Reinvestment Policy provides guidelines for determining the portion of the annual investment earnings to be distributed to cover charitable distributions and service fees and to be reinvested in the Endowment Funds to provide a reserve against both inflation and lower investment returns. This policy helps to ensure that there is a reasonably consistent level of charitable distributions over the long term.

On an annual basis, the Board of Governors establishes the level of distribution and reinvestment, taking into account various factors including community needs, the current level of reinvested earnings, and the investment earnings for the year.

In 2006, the investment earnings in Endowment Funds totalling \$10,180 (2005 - \$6,166) were allocated as follows:
