# Ottawa's centre for community philanthropy

Created by and for the people of Ottawa, the Community Foundation of Ottawa is a public, non-profit organization that has been serving the community since 1987. Our role is to connect people who care with causes that matter, enabling generous citizens to enhance the quality of life for all in our community. As a respected community convener, we provide local leadership by bringing people together from all sectors to identify and address issues in our community in a proactive manner.

## The Community Foundation of Ottawa manages a large variety of funds on behalf of an ever-growing number of donors.

**Community Funds** constitute the core of the Community Foundation's ability to strengthen our community by meeting emerging opportunities and addressing issues of importance as they change over time.

**Field of Interest Funds** allow donors to direct grants to a particular area of interest, such as social services, the arts or the environment.

**Donor Advised Funds** allow donors to advise the Community Foundation each year as to which charitable organizations are to receive grants from their funds, and in what amounts.

**Designated Funds** allow donors to choose specific charitable organizations that will be perpetual beneficiaries of the annual income generated by their gifts.

**Educational Award Funds** are used to provide educational awards, scholarships and bursaries to help students pursue academic goals.

**Memorial Funds** can be established through the Community Foundation in order to create a lasting tribute to a special member of the community or loved one.

**Organizational Endowments** can be established by organizations with registered charitable status in order to benefit from the Community Foundation's professional investment management and expertise.

**Flow-Through Funds** allow donors to give advice on disbursements to charitable organizations or causes within a given year.

Whether you're a charity, a donor, a grant recipient or concerned citizen, philanthropy touches us all.

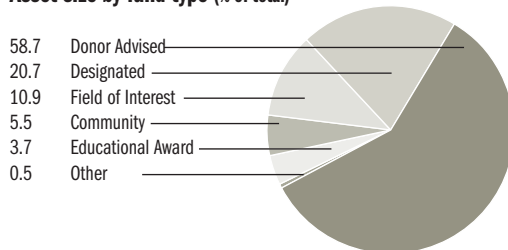
It's our job – and great privilege – to act as a link in this chain of giving.

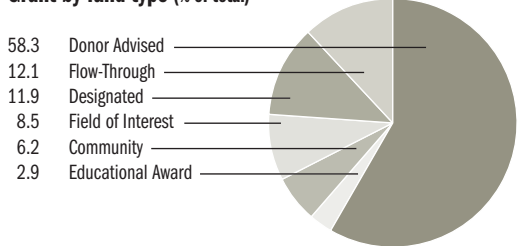
**Asset size by fund type (% of total)**

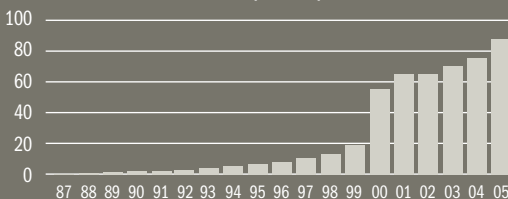

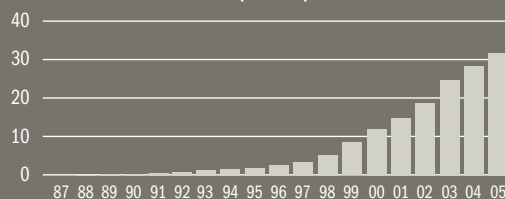



# Investing in People Award

## **Adrienne Coddett**

A high-school law and history teacher, Adrienne has dedicated her life to helping youth both inside and outside of the classroom.

Creating and organizing an annual black youth conference at Woodroffe High School is just one of her many accomplishments. Adrienne has performed groundbreaking work raising awareness amongst youth of the global impact of HIV/AIDS, and galvanizing Ottawa's black youth community to be active on a worldwide scale through the International Black Summit. Also a first-class basketball coach, Adrienne has mentored and shaped numerous young men into some of Canada's best basketball players.

The Community Foundation of Ottawa's Investing in People Award has been presented each year since 1993 to support those who have shown imagination and leadership in addressing issues and opportunities in our community. Selected by the Foundation's Board of Governors, recipients are invited to accept a \$5000 grant for which they design the purposes. Adrienne will use the grant to more fully establish her own foundation, 3Dreads and a Baldhead, which seeks to provide opportunities for people of black African descent to transform their lives and maximize their physical, mental, spiritual, and economic potential.

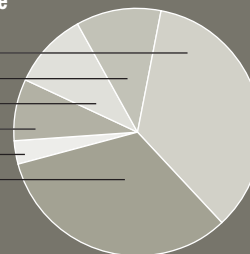

## G.E. (Ted) Beament: Community Champion

Ted Beament's story is one of love and triumph in the face of adversity. A decorated soldier and top Ottawa lawyer, Ted's final victory came at the age of 95 when he was reunited with his wife of 63 years, Brenda, after a painful five months spent in separate residences for the elderly. His great sense of justice led Ted to fight, not only for their last days together, but for all couples who might face the same kind of intolerable situation. As a professional soldier, engineer and lawyer, Ted tackled each problem from every possible angle - including those he saw within his community. Former Canadian Chancellor of the Order of St. John, and someone who donated to The Mission faithfully since the 1930's, Ted led a long life of community service that ended with the final, generous gesture of opening the Beament Fund. This \$400,000 unrestricted Community Fund will support Ted Beament's community long into the future.

## Marjorie Loughrey: Guardian Angel for the Arts

The Marjorie Loughrey Fund honours the work of its namesake through the Artists in the Elementary Schools Award, which allows an artist to spend five days working with students in a high-needs Ottawa school each year. Marjorie passed away in October 2005, leaving a legacy of enhanced support for the arts in Ottawa. Often described as a guardian angel for the arts community, it was Marjorie who spearheaded the creation of the renowned arts program at Canterbury High School in 1983. The Marjorie Loughrey Fund's first award will support a musical enrichment program at R. Burns Curry Public School with Goyo, a Music Education specialist.

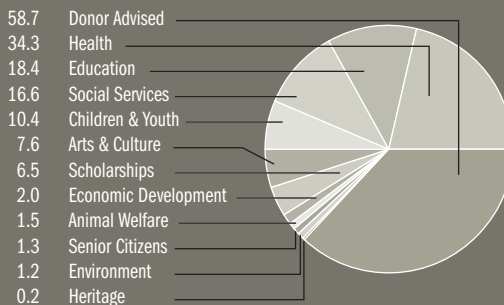

## Applying for a Grant

### The Foundation grant programs benefit us all.

The Community Foundation provides funding through two different grant programs: the Community Grants Program and the Strategic Impact Grants Program.

Community Grants are made for projects in support of social services (including projects for the visually impaired, children, youth, seniors), animal welfare, arts and culture, community economic development, education, environment, and health, primarily within the Ottawa region. The average grant is approximately \$7,000, with the largest grant of up to \$10,000 being provided for projects which are particularly innovative and compelling.

Strategic Impact Grants are broader than Community Grants and may include multi-year funding, larger amounts (over \$10,000), project funding, as well as grants which focus on building organizational capacity or seeding new programs.

The Community Foundation solicits and accepts grant applications from organizations that meet our funding guidelines. These grants are supported by the generosity of donors who have directed their funds to unrestricted purposes or to a broad field of interest. Grants may also be selected for funding by one or more donors.

A voluntary Grants Committee, comprised of representatives of the community and professional advisors, evaluates applications and makes recommendations to the Board of Governors. The Board awards the grants within the parameters of the available funds.

# Notes to the Summarized Financial Statements

## 1. Distribution and reinvestment of annual investment earnings

The Foundation's Distribution and Reinvestment Policy provides guidelines for determining the portion of the annual investment earnings to be distributed to cover charitable distributions and service fees and to be reinvested in the endowment funds to provide a reserve against both inflation and lower investment returns. This policy helps to ensure that there is a reasonably consistent level of charitable distributions over the long term.

On an annual basis, the Board of Governors establishes the level of distribution and reinvestment, taking into account various factors including community needs, the current level of reinvested earnings, and the investment earnings for the year.

In 2005, the investment earnings totalling \$6,236 (2004 - \$6,086) were allocated as follows:

## 2. Investments

### *Determination of carrying value*

Cash and short-term investments which include investment certificates and treasury bills are valued at cost which approximates market value at the year-end.

Bonds and publicly traded shares are recorded at prices based on published market quotations at the year-end.

Shares in a private Canadian corporation are recorded at cost and are written down only when there has been a decline that is other than temporary. The cost was determined by an independent appraiser at the time of their donation to the Foundation. The carrying value is based on management's best estimates of the private corporation's current share value.

## 4. Real estate

The Community Foundation of Ottawa shares ownership of a property known as Fairfields, a designated historical property. The property is recorded at the appraised value at the time of donation, which was determined by an independent appraiser at the time of the donation. The expenses related to the management and upkeep of the property are funded by a designated endowment fund.

## 5. Managed funds

The Foundation holds within its assets, amounts which belong to other charitable organizations. The amounts are pooled with the investments of the Foundation and are offset by the managed fund liability on the summarized balance sheet. All revenue and expenses accruing to these funds are not reflected in the summarized statement of operations and changes in fund balances.

## 6. Retractable funds

The Foundation holds within its assets, amounts which may with one year's notice be returned to other charitable organizations. The amounts are pooled with the investments of the Foundation and the original capital is represented by the retractable funds liability on the summarized balance sheet. All investment revenues are owned wholly by the Foundation and are reflected in the summarized statement of operations and changes in fund balances.

## 7. Comparative amounts

The comparative amounts presented in the summarized financial statements have been restated to conform to the current year's presentation.
